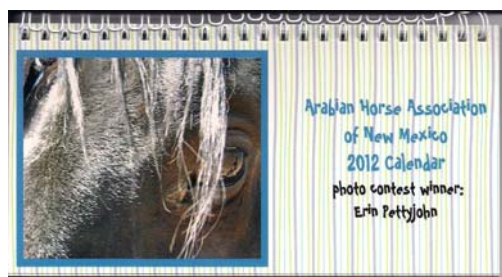

Convention Report Vancouver – 2011

The 2011 AHA Convention was held in Vancouver, Canada, November 17-19. The 266 credentialed delegates dealt with 15 resolutions that had been presented. Resolutions 5-11, 12-11 & 14-11 passed as originals. 1-11, 2-11, 6-11, 7-11, 9-11, and 15-11 passed as amended. 8-11 was disapproved. The rest were withdrawn.

As was anticipated, the most hotly discussed collection of resolutions were 8-11, 10-11 and 11-11 which was aimed at returning to subjective judging in the halter classes or giving the shows an option to not use the scorecard. AHANM had given this delegate the leeway to listen to the discussion and the objective of the proponent before making a decision. I attended the Professional Horseman's Committee and the Equine Stress/Research & Education Committee where these 3 resolutions were discussed and it soon became apparent to me this was more of the same old to return the halter classes to showmanship classes and away from breeding classes. There were numerous excellent rebuttals to the resolution proponent in the committee meetings and during the General Session. Resolution 8-11 was resoundingly defeated by the delegates, which prompted the withdrawal of 10-11 and 11-11.

Resolution 1-11 Redefining Age Limit for Youth was postponed until the Saturday General Session so youth members would be there to talk about it. The resolution sparked more discussion than I would have anticipated. It was successfully passed although it does have to go through USEF for vetting before final approval. All of our

resolutions that deal with rule changes have to go through this process. Only resolutions that deal with the workings of AHA are exempt.

I also attended the Sport Horse Committee and the Hunter/Jumper Committee. Both of those committees have suffered under lack of affective leadership for the last couple of years. I am pleased to announce the new chair of the SHC will be Janet Henderson and the new chair of the H/JC will be Alan Erlich. Both of those appointments should allow for the development and forward movement of those disciplines. I am a member of both those committees and have been given the go ahead by Chairman Erlich to work on a resolution taking out the 12' stride mention and removing the required combination from the Arabian H/J rules. Both of these rules were put in to help give the Arabian H/J some credibility with the Open H/J set but our variation in size of horses within classes causes one set of horses (either the largest or smallest) to be at a disadvantage.

The East/ West rotation passed for Sport Horse Nationals so the next SHN will be in Nampa, Idaho Sept. 19-23, 2012. It will then rotate back and forth with Lexington, VA as the other site.

The Canadian Nationals made a \$77,000 profit. Tulsa had an increase in horses to 1805. The U.S. National Show Commission is soliciting bids from other locations around the country. The City of Tulsa continues to court AHA and has offered \$500,000 per year if AHA will re-sign the contract.

I attended the Meet The Candidates Forum, which was a debate between Dale Havell and Bruce Johnson for the office of AHA Vice President. The AHA Officers remain the same for another year.

Convention will be in Denver next on Nov. 14-17, 2012. Convention will then move to Lexington, KY for 2013 and then back to Denver for 3 years.

A presentation was given regarding the Arabian Horseman Disaster Fund (AHDF). This is a 501 (c) 3 set up to help horseman in our community. Your donations are tax deductible.

It was reported that Region 8 and Region 6 had the most One Day shows for 2011. This format seems to meet the needs of several groups and I am pleased to see AHANM is willing to give this format a trial in 2012 with the first training show of the year to be a One Day Show. Depending on the success of that show then the option of changing a couple more of the training shows into One Days are possibilities.

The Region 8 Show Commission held a meeting during the convention. Please look for the minutes of that meeting in this newsletter.

The Region 8 Caucus was held on Thursday evening. Region 8 officers will remain the same. With the loss of over \$11,000 from our main ring and sport horse 2010 shows, our 2012 budget has been trimmed to the basics. The Sport Horse Regionals will be combined with the Zia Classic in Albuquerque, NM beginning on May 10th with qualifying classes followed by the Region 8 SH Championship classes.

The Region 8 Championships Main Ring will be June 5-9. The classes will start on Tuesday afternoon similar to the schedule for last year. The delegate meeting to Friday during lunch with the hope this will be more convenient for the delegates and members. Liz Wheeler will be working with the show patrons and Deb Ludington will be handling the corporate sponsors. The show commission is working on the schedule that will closely follow the same format as 2011.

The Keynote Speaker during the General Session on Saturday was Dr

Jim Heird. Dr. Heird is Executive Professor and Coordinator of the Equine Sciences Initiative at Texas A&M University. An AQHA judge, Dr. Heird covered several topics that are current hot issues in the horse industry, including unwanted horse management, horses as livestock vs companion animals, wild horse management, training and overuse of young horses, performance enhancing medications, show ring ethics, training and medication use and legislative decisions affecting livestock and horse industries.

It was an honor to represent the Arabian Horse Association of New Mexico at the Arabian Horse Association Convention and I appreciate your support. The 2012 Convention will be held in Denver, 2013 will be in Lexington, KY and then will return to Denver for 3 years.

Region 8 Show Commission Meeting Minutes Vancouver, 2011

1. Show Guidelines

Review of Guidelines continues with the goal of having the corrected and updated Guidelines ready for the delegates' approval at the June, 2012 meeting. Until that time an effort will be made to follow the existing Guidelines. If the Commission needs to make a decision or, there is a change that is in conflict with the current Guidelines, then it must be voted on by the Commission prior to effecting said change.

2. 2013 Judges & Steward List

The commissioners submitted a list of 30+ total judges and the list was pared down to 9 judges who appeared 2 or more times. Commissioners then ranked that list and the judges, plus one steward, have been selected. Pat will begin contacting those judges and steward for the 2013 show.

As per the Guidelines the fees have been set at: less than 250 horses = \$400/day, 251 – 300 horses = \$450/day, 301 or more horses \$500/day. The steward will be paid \$200/day.

3. Schedule/# of days MR

The schedule for the 2012 show will remain 4 ½ days. Tuesday will start in the afternoon with the working cow horse, followed by trail. The arrival of the cattle will be up to management. Ample settling time for the cattle will be allowed and those working cow horse exhibitors who are settling cattle will determine start time. Roby is not to rush this process and needs to be so instructed.

4. Move Delegate Meeting to middle of show

The delegate meeting will be moved to Friday, June 8 at 11:45 or a half hour after the morning session; whichever is later. The exhibitor Bar B Q will be held during this time and the Youth Classes will be held in the warm-up paddock. The afternoon session will not begin until 2:00 PM.

5. Prize money

No additional payback will be offered in 2012

6. Carrol Lee, Mobil Music, Doug

A change in announcer, based on total cost to include airfare, hotel and fee, is being investigated. Pat will contact Terry Wagner for his day fee/Cassi (music) is \$150/day. Liz will contact Doug to see what his fee/costs would be. Carrol Lee's total cost will be calculated. Once these totals are calculated the Commission will make a decision on the announcer/music.

7. Sponsorship/Patronship

Liz Wheeler and Deb Ludington are co-chairing the Sponsorship and Patron program. Liz will be sending out letters to immediate past Patron and previous exhibitors to solicit sponsorship

for the show. Clubs will be contacted to sponsor a class as per the Guidelines. We currently have a commitment from East Kansas, Mesilla Valley, Guardian and CAHC. The request has been placed on the December agenda with AHANM.

8. Sport Horse Regionals

The Sport Horse Regional Championships will be on May 12 & 13.

9. Ribbons

The ribbons and plaques for both the MR and SH Regionals will be updated from the Regional Ribbon Bank. This will need to be done early enough for SH so they can be shipped. If anyone knows of someone traveling from CO to NM any time from the first of March to the end of April please let the commission know.

10. MR Regional dates for 2013

The Fort Worth facility has moved the Region 9 dates on top of the Region 8 dates and, it is rumored, given Region 9 \$200,000 which will be added to their prize money. This could have a major impact on Region 8. Jim Hitt will contact National Western to explore the possibility of moving the dates of Region 8 to the end of June.

11. Vet for MR

Chuck reports Littleton Large Animal Clinic will charge \$500/day to have a vet on premise (no hotel/no transportation). USEF has increased the number to 250 before requiring a vet on the grounds. Once these totals are calculated the Commission will make a decision on the vet.

Blanketing 101 - Snug as a Bug In a Rug

Does my horse need a blanket? He might if he needs protection from the weather, bugs, ultraviolet light or lack of hair coat. Most healthy horses are naturally protected from the weather. Their hair coat changes with the seasons – becoming thicker in the winter and thinner in the summer. This change is based on the shortening or lengthening of the days. As long as the healthy horse has shelter from wind; cold, damp rain and access to shade, he should be fine. The key word is “healthy”. There are instances when a horse needs the added protection of a blanket or sheet.

Old age – senior horses lose the ability to regulate body temperature; the coat may become less thick and a decrease in insulating body fat may be a problem. In a herd situation the old-timer may not be allowed in the shelter. In addition to providing a blanket for added warmth, the senior horse must have his nutritional needs addressed. If other horses are not allowing him in the shelter, he needs to be moved.

Illness - horses that are ill and running a fever may need a blanket to help regulate body temperature. Consult your veterinarian.

Light - Horses that suffer from photosensitization need to be protected from ultraviolet light. These horses have severe reactions when exposed to sunlight ... their skin “sunburns”, becomes crusty and painful. A sheet rated for UV protection is a must for these horses if they are in sunlight. Healthy horses in abnormal conditions may also require a blanket.

Show or performance horses - horses that are clipped or kept under lights to limit hair growth need to be blanketed. They no longer have insulation which long hair provides. Horses being hauled may need to be blanketed to keep warm. Care must be taken they don't become too warm in the trailer. After exercise a horse may need a cooler (a sheet made of material that will absorb sweat) to ward off a chill. It's very important a hot horse is cooled out properly. Replace the damp cooler with a dry blanket or sheet before putting the horse up. In addition to warmth, show horses are kept blanketed to keep the coat from fading in the sunlight, keep the hair lying flat and clean. Light weight sheets are great for fly control. In addition to sheets, leg protection and neck attachments are available to help ward off flies. Special fly sheets are light weight and breathable.
